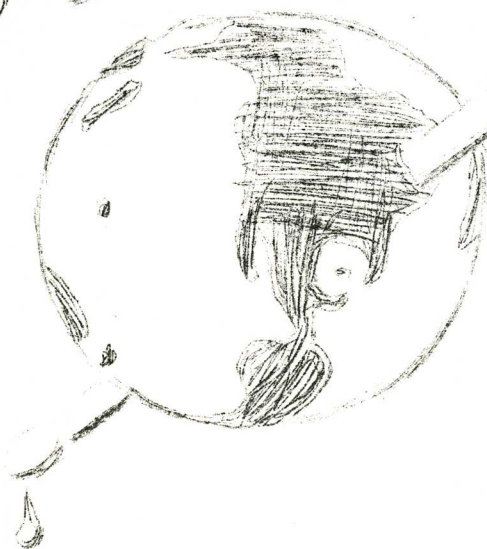

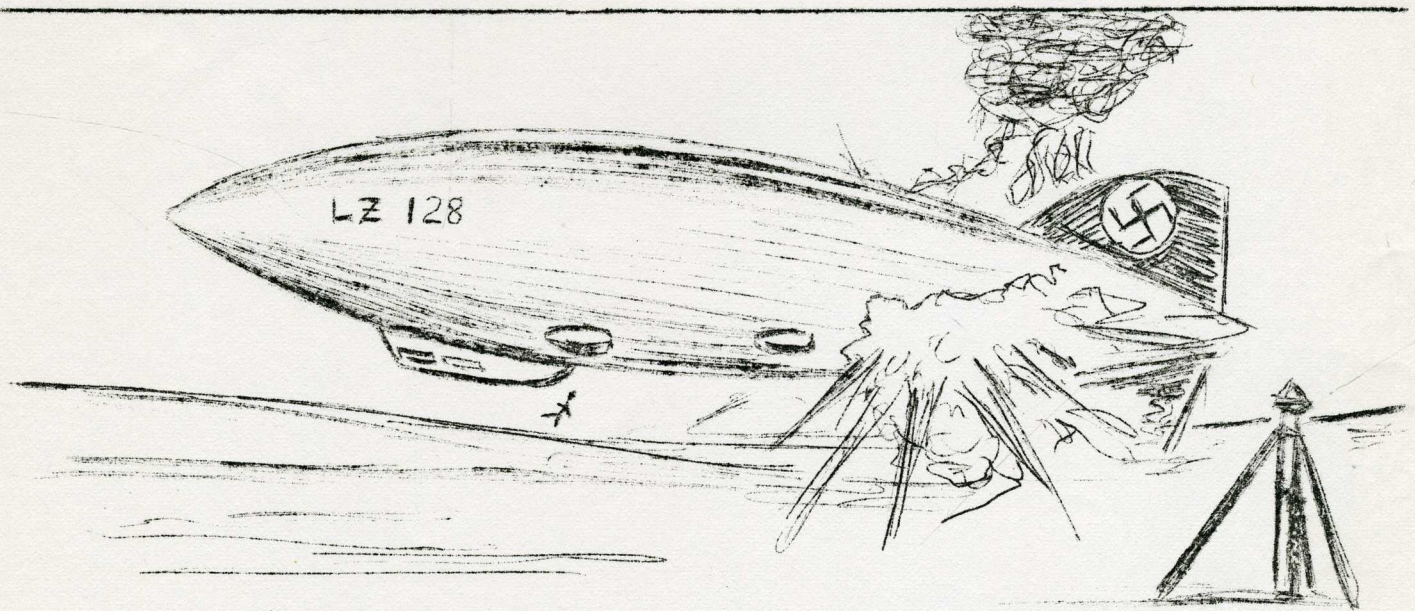
A spokesman for the immunization project said he was still unsure what had caused the mixup, but was confident that the sidewalk at the home would not suffer from swine flu this year.
